



SNIPE LAKE

Snipe Lake is a popular spot for ice fishing, and the action continues consistently all year.

Gerry Williscroft of **Snipe Lake South Shore Resort**, says that the pike and perch are the big draws. Both species are plentiful, and "you can almost get them as soon as you drop your line."

For perch, he suggests using small lures. Try bright colours in low light conditions. Evening is a good time to go after perch.

Head straight out from the boat launch about 100 yards, Williscroft suggests.

A Five of Diamonds or a Red Devil is a good choice for pike, Williscroft notes. These have proven to attract some large pike.

Another species in the lake is walleye. Williscroft says they caught a 13 pound walleye last summer using a Five of Diamonds.

Williscroft says there are several different places on the lake that are especially productive. The southeast corner just out from the spawning area is a good choice. As well, on the east edge around the corner from the campground, people have had good luck just out from the water plant.

LAKE ACCESS

There are a couple of different ways to get to Snipe Lake. Valleyview is the closest town to Snipe Lake. Valleyview Alberta is located approximately 345 km. to the north of Edmonton.

If you travel west on highway 16 out of Edmonton, then turn onto highway 43 to Valleyview, you will go through the townsite of Valleyview to Highway 747, to twp. road 710 and range road 191.

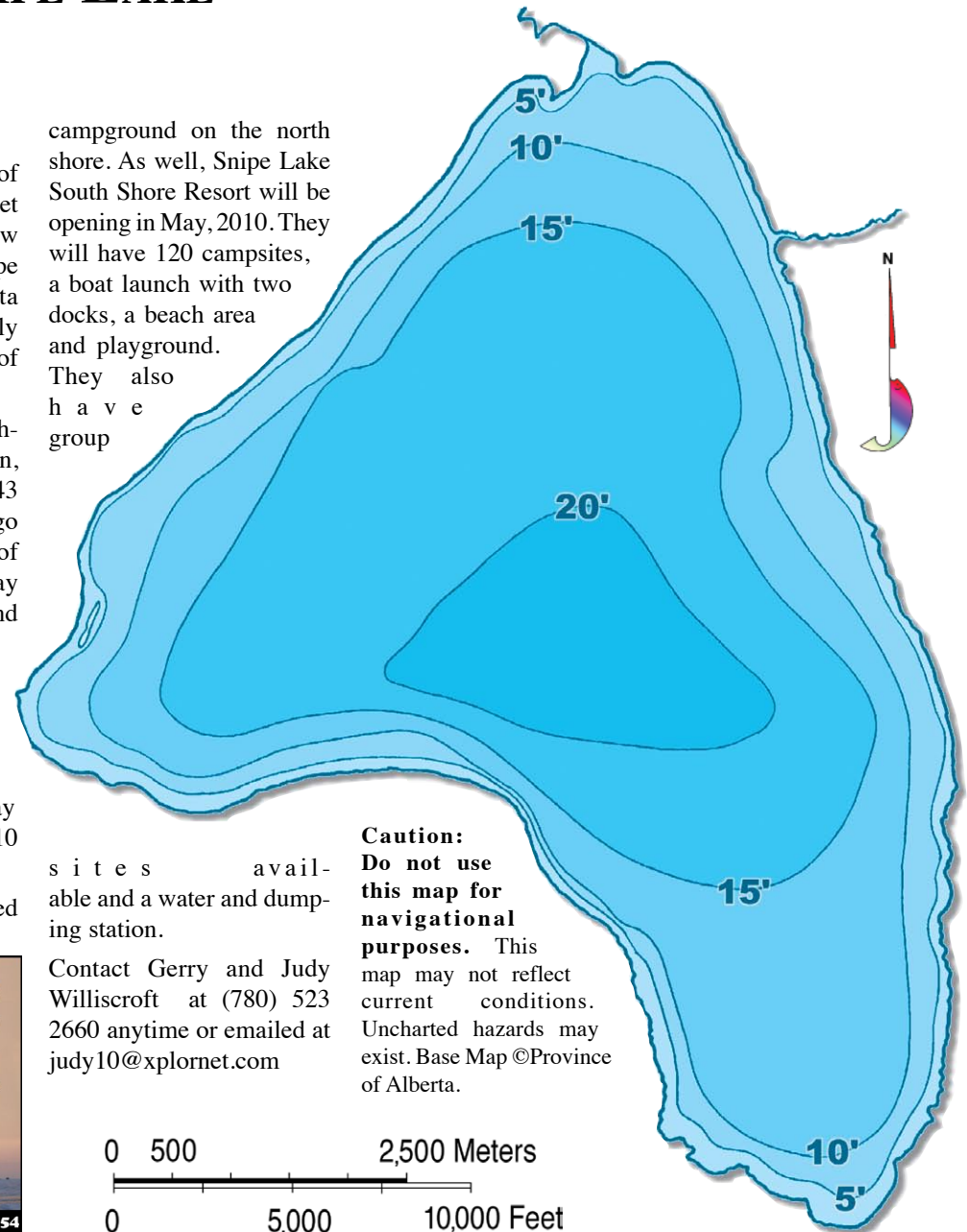
If you leave Edmonton by Highway #2 you will pass through the town of High Prairie. turn left on highway 747 and stay on that until twp. road 710 and range road 191.

There is an unserviced

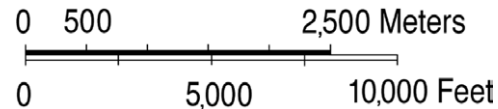
campground on the north shore. As well, Snipe Lake South Shore Resort will be opening in May, 2010. They will have 120 campsites, a boat launch with two docks, a beach area and playground. They also have group

sites available and a water and dumping station.
